In order to best serve our students, our middle school classes (grades 6-8) will be taught by our middle school staff team. Each class' homeroom teacher will lead numeracy, literacy, and bible courses. Mrs. Baxter will begin the 2024/25 school year as our grade 8 homeroom teacher, with Mrs. Friesen returning to STCCS in January. We are committed to ensuring a smooth transition after Christmas break, and we look forward to a successful year.
